The Beatitudes

The next Beatitude Jesus teaches us in Matthew 5:9 is *Blessed* are the Peacemakers for they will be called the sons of God. Let's look at how Nehemiah used God's wisdom and guidance to be a peacemaker for the Tsrealites.



Blessed are the Peacemakers.. (Matt 5:9, Nehemiah)

When King Nebuchadnezzar destroyed Jerusalem 152 years before, he knocked down the walls and burned the city's gates. The Israelites did not build the walls again when they first came home from Babylon. Walls around cities were protection for the people. How do you think the people have felt living here all those years without walls around their city? They have not felt safe. Their enemies could easily come in and attack them. But now this man Nehemiah was finally helping the people to build the walls again. Do you know who Nehemiah was?

Nehemiah was an Israelite who came from the city of Shushan. Nehemiah was the chief cupbearer for King Artaxerxes. This means that he served the king his wine, and made sure that no one tried to poison the king. It was a very important job.

Artaxerxes was the good king who gave Ezra all that money to take back to Jerusalem to fix up Jehovah's temple. But Ezra did not build the broken-down walls of the



city. It had been
13 years since Artaxerxes gave Ezra the money to fix
up the temple.

Well, one day Nehemiah's brother Hanani and other men from the land of Israel came to visit Nehemiah. They told him about the trouble

the Israelites were having, and how the walls of Jerusalem were still broken down. This made Nehemiah very sad, and he prayed to Jehovah about it.

One day the king noticed that Nehemiah was sad, and asked: 'Why are you looking

so sad?' Nehemiah told him that it was because Jerusalem was in such bad condition and the walls were broken down. 'What is it that you want?' the king asked.

'Let me go to Jerusalem,' Nehemiah said, 'so that I may rebuild the walls.' King Artaxerxes was very kind. He said




that Nehemiah may go, and he helped him to get wood for doing some of the building. Soon after Nehemiah came to Jerusalem, he told the people about his plans. They liked the idea, and said: 'Let's start building.'


When the enemies of the Israelites saw the wall going up, they said: 'We will go up and kill them, and stop the building work.' But Nehemiah hear about this, and he gave the workers swords and spears. And he said: 'Don't be afraid of our enemies. Fight for your brothers, for your children, for your wives, and for your homes.'


The people were very brave. They kept their weapons ready day and night, and they kept building. So in just 52 days the walls were finished. Now the people felt safe inside the city. Nehemiah and Ezra taught the people God's law, and the people were happy.



Nehemiah used his faith and God's guidance to be a peacemaker for the Israelites among each other and with the surrounding people.






