Parables of Jesus



Parable - The Lost Sheep and Coin (Luke 15:1-10)

This week we are going to be talking about 2 parables. But these 2 parables are very similar stories and have the same message about how Jesus cares about us. Before we start, who remembers what a parable is? Right, a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In other words, it's a story about something we can all understand about something most of us know about, but that story helps us learn something new about heaven, or Jesus, the church and God's plan for us, something we may not be familiar with.

The Jews, particularly the Pharisees, did not like what Jesus was telling the people or who He was teaching, etc. On this occasion, the Pharisees were upset that Jesus was talking to and eating with sinners and tax-collectors. Jesus answered their complaint by telling them these 2 parables:

There was a shepherd who had 100 sheep, but one of them got lost. The

shepherd left the 99 sheep to go find the one that was missing. He looked all over until the lamb was found. When he found him, the shepherd carried the sheep back to the others on his shoulders. When he returned with the missing sheep he called all his friends to come rejoice with him for the sheep that was lost is found.





There was a woman who had 10 coins. She lost one of them. She lit her lamp and looked everywhere. She searched her whole house until she found the coin that was missing. When she found it, she called all her friends to come and rejoice with her for

the coin that was lost is found.

In just the same way, when a sinner (someone who does something wrong) repents and asks God to forgive him there is rejoicing over the one that was lost. Jesus is like the shepherd who lost his sheep and the woman who lost her coin. He came to earth to save us, the lost. And every time someone is saved Jesus rejoices.


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
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




- 1. Print this page and color the sheep. Glue the page to a thin piece of cardboard, such as a recycled cereal box or manila folder.

- 3. Fold in half along the solid line, so your sheep stands up. If you want, draw a picture of a field or farm and use it as a background for your sheep.








Sheep Search




