


Parable - The Sower (Matthew 13)

We have learned how to be a light, how to build our house on the solid rock of God's word and how Jesus came to save all of us who are lost. So, who remembers what a parable is? Right, a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In other words, it's a story about something we can all understand about something most of us know about, but that story helps us learn something new about heaven, or Jesus, the church and God's plan for us, something we may not be familiar with. Today, we are going to read a parable about a sower, or farmer, who was sowing or planting seeds.

Jesus told His disciples this parable:

One day, a farmer went out to plant his crops. As he scattered the seeds, some fell on the hard ground or road that created a path between the fields. Almost immediately after the seeds landed on the ground, birds swooped down and ate them all.






Some of the farmer's seeds fell on the rocky soil. The seeds grew in the sun and rain, but there wasn't enough dirt for the seedlings to take root. They kept bumping into rocks. Soon, they couldn't hold themselves up and they withered and died.

Other seeds fell among the thorns or weeds. As the seeds grew so did the thorns. But they grew faster and bigger taking all the sun, soil and water. Before long, the thorns choked the life out of the new plants.



But there were some seeds that landed in the good soil which was rich with nutrients and clear of rocks and thorns. These seeds grew big and strong and produced a great crop.

Now, we know that all of Jesus' parables tell a good story about something we can understand, but they also have a deeper meaning. So, let's look at this parable and see what Jesus is saying about the word of God being sown in our lives or in our hearts.






The seed that fell on the road or the hard path and was eaten by the birds is the person who hears God's word but doesn't listen to it. He has no interest in what Jesus has to say and turns away from God. He would rather enjoy the things of the world than listen to God.

The seed that fell on the rocky ground are like the people who are eager to hear God's word. But then doubts and fears creep in. The seed, or God's word, started to grow but they soon turned back to the world.

And what about the seed that grew among the thorns? Well, that's like the person who hears God's word and believes, but over time, life and the things of the world slowly take over and become more important than God's word. Eventually there is no room left for Jesus and God's word.

Now the seeds that land on the good soil that was rich in nutrients are like the one who hears God's word, believe and follow Him. They do their best to follow God, study His word and learn how He wants us to be like Him. We walk as Jesus would walk, showing love and other fruits of the spirit as found in Galatians 5:22-23. And in following Him we share His word with others, do good works and grow and produce a great crop.

Hands-on Activity:


Have the children toss some seeds on the ground, parking lot, or grass, and then have a special pot with soil for them to plant some seeds. You can tend to it each day or give the children their own little cups or pots with seeds so they can tend to it. Next week, compare what happened to the seeds.

- Look for the seeds on the parking lot -- did they disappear or grow?
- What about the ones over by the rocks?
- What about around the grass?
- How are the seeds in the pot growing?

Go back over the parable as you explain our faith and love for God. Are we ready to let our love for God take root and grow deep?








A farmer went out to plant one day. The seeds were scattered every which way.






Some seeds fell on the path near the field. 3






The birds came down and ate their fill.


Some seeds fell in a weedy patch. The weeds grew tall and took over the plants.






Some seeds fell on the rocky ground. But no plants grew. None could be found.




