Parables of Jesus



Parable - Two Builders (Matthew 7:24-27)

For the past couple weeks we have been talking about the Parables of Jesus. Who remembers what a parable is? Right, a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In other words, it's a story about something we can all understand about something most of us know about, but that story helps us learn something new about heaven, or Jesus, the church and God's plan for us, something we may not be familiar with. 
showing His love to others. Today's is parable is about houses. Let's take a look.

 There were two men who wanted to build a house. One man built his house on a solid rock. The rock was strong, flat and sturdy. He was very wise.





The other man built his house on the sand. (Have you ever built a sand castle? What happens to the sand when the water comes? It washes it away. Its not sturdy at all.) Jesus says this man was foolish.





Once the houses were finished it began to rain. It rained so much that both the wise man's house and the foolish man's house were flooded. The wise man's house got wet, but the solid rock on the foundation (or under the

house) stayed and it stood

firm. However, when the foolish man's house was flooded, the sand underneath washed away and the whole house fell down.

Just like the wise man who built his house on the solid rock, we are told to build



our lives on a solid rock. What do you think that solid rock is? It's God's word. If we build our lives on reading God's word and following God we will have a firm foundation. So when bad things happen or when things go wrong we know to turn to God $\frac{1}{2}$ and He will help us through.

If we build our lives on the things of the world, which is like the foolish man, then when we have problems or things go wrong we don't turn to God for His help.
