
Parables of Jesus

Parable - The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)

Who remembers what a parable is? That's right, a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In other words, it's a story that we can easily understand to help explain something more complicated that we may not easily understand. Over the last several weeks we have discussed many parables. We have learned how to be a light, a wise man who built his house on the rock, the rich fool taught us what our priorities should be, and we learned about being a sower and how to hear God's Word.

People were always asking Jesus questions. Sometimes they truly wanted to know the answer, but sometimes they were only trying to see what Jesus would say.

Once, when Jesus was talking to the people, they were discussing the law,

"Love your neighbor as yourself." A lawyer stood up and asked Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?"

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Instead of answering him with a few words, Jesus told him this parable:

A Jewish man was traveling alone from Jerusalem to Jericho. As he was crossing the mountains he was attacked by robbers.



They beat him, tore his clothes, took his money and left him lying on the side of the road to die.

At last, a priest came by and saw the injured man. Now a priest knows the old law and the commandment, "Love thy neighbor as thyself. But guess what? He did not stop to help him but continued down the other side of the road ignoring the man hurt on the side of the Π

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
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Later, a Levite, another Jew who knows God's word and that same commandment, "Love thy neighbor as thyself." Well he didn't stop to help the hurt man but continued down the other side of the road to where he was headed.

Eventually, another man finally came down the road with his donkey. He was from Samaria. The Samaritan saw the wounded man. He stopped his donkey, jumped off and ran to the man's side. The Samaritan saw that the man lying at his feet was a Jew. The Samaritans and the Jews hated each, and did not call each other neighbor. But this Samaritan was



sorry for the poor man. He forgot about all their differences and helped the injured man. He cleaned his wounds, gave him some water and put the hurt man on his own donkey. Then the good Samaritan pulled the donkey down the road with the



injured man on the back.

When they arrived at an inn (or hotel) the Samaritan got the injured man a place to stay and paid the innkeeper to care for him until he was well.

Jesus then turned to the lawyer and asked him which man was a neighbor to the injured man. (And what did he say? Of course, the Samaritan was the neighΠ

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bor.) The lawyer replied that the Samaritan was the neighbor. Jesus told the lawyer and all who were listening to go and do likewise.

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So, who is my neighbor? Yes, it's the person who lives next door or down the street. But its also the person I see at school that needs a friend or the kid in bible class who needs help, or so many other things. My neighbor is anyone in need that I can help.


