
Parables of Jesus


Parable - The Workers in the Vineyard (Matt 20:1-16)

Who remembers what a parable is? That's right, a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. In other words, it's a story that we can easily understand to help explain something more complicated that we may not easily understand. Over the last several weeks we have discussed many parables. We have learned how to be a light, a wise man who built his house on the rock, the rich fool taught us what our priorities should be, and we learned about being a sower and how to hear God's Word. Today's parable teaches us another lesson on the kingdom of heaven.


Jesus says:

1 "For the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. 2After agreeing with the laborers for a de-

narius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. 3And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, 4and to them he said, 'You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you.' 5So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. 6And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' 7They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the



vineyard too.' 8And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning




with the last, up to the first.' 9And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. 10Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. 11And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, 12saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' 13But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? 14Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. 15Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' 16So the last will be first, and the first last."


Just like the workers in the vineyard, Christians are to follow Jesus and will receive our reward (payment) of a home in heaven. God wants us to follow and love Him. It does not matter who follows first or who follows longer as long as we follow and love Him, sharing Him with others, so they can follow too. And one day we will all share a home in heaven with God.

Following Jesus is not a competition with our fellow Christians, it's a job we do together to all receive the same reward in heaven some day.





Workers in the Vineyard Matt 20:1-16




